# Reports

Dr. Isoye reported the following: 1) congratulations were due to Tabula advisors Dan Ganschow and Michelle Carrow and the students who helped create the 2012-2013 Tabula which recently won a first place award in the American Scholastic Press Association's annual contest for school yearbooks, magazines, and newspapers, receiving a score of 940 out of a possible 1,000; 2) Not since 1981 or before have all four team levels of football been 4-0, including the early 1980s when the Huskies were state semifinalists three times; 3) The Chicago Tribute did an article on Physics teacher Aaron Podolner and his book How Would You Handle It?, which is a series of 400 reality-based questions and scenarios to help prepare teachers for difficult situations; 4) Japanese teacher Yoko Schmadeke earned a \$5,000 grant from the Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Chicago Foundation, which will be used for the annual cultural festival that she and her students put on each winter; 5) for the past two weeks 11 German students have been staying with OPRF host families and shadowing their host students throughout the school day; 6) OPRF students and staff will be featured live on Fox 32 on Friday, September 27. As part of his "Patrick's People and Places," reporter Patrick Elwood is going to be visiting locations in Oak Park and River Forest throughout the morning's broadcast. OPRF football and field hockey players, marching band, cheer and drill teams, lots of our student-club members, Mr. Rouse, and coaches will be on the football field for a live, four-minute segment scheduled for 7:30 a.m.; 7) The next Special Board
