Reports

Principal Rouse reported on 1) the smooth opening of the school; and 2) Homecoming events scheduled for Friday and Saturday, October 3 and 4, 2008; 3) the 2008 Non-graduates and Summer 2008 Graduates; and 4) OPRFHS's six foreign exchange students, one from France, Spain, Finland, Thailand, and two for Germany.

Superintendent Weninger reported that 1) the District was optimistically waiting to hear if it were successful in its grant applications to AT&T and to the ISBE; 2) information would be

sent to the Board of Education regarding the proposed Illinois Constitutional Convention (endorsed by the Illinois Association of School Boards (IASB); 3) the first Board of Education workshop this year on race and student achievement, scheduled for Thursday, November 13, facilitated by Bill Gregory, executive director of the Indiana University Northwest's Center for Management Development; 4) the District looks forward to the first Leadership Roundtable hosted by All District Administrators and members of the Faculty Senate Executive Committee (FSEC) on October 28; 5) approximately 80 parents visited the high school on Tuesday, September 23 for Parent Visitation Day; 6) he and Jan Pate, Oak Park Village Trustee and vice president of the YMCA, will bring together a representative group of community leaders to identify how to survey middle school and high school students from Forest Park, Oak Park, and River Forest, as a follow-up to the Assets Rich presentation last spring; 7) the Annual Triple I (IASB, IASBO, and ISBE) Conference will be in Chicago, November 21-23; 8) a legislative breakfast with several area House and Senate legislators is scheduled for October 10 at the high school; 9) Jason Edgecombe and he will attend the annual AASPA Conference in Seattle on personnel matters, including recruitment; 10) the Oak Park and River Forest Community Foundation was awarded the Community Works Phase 3 Grant from Grand Victoria Foundation, a \$1 million endowment and \$1 million operating endowment. The Foundation is now eligible for the \$2 million challenge grant over the next three years. The primary goals of the application are education and sustainability—Ensuring the Success of All Young People through Quality Education and Achieving an Environmentally Sustainable Community. The high school will play a role with other community agencies in leveraging the grant towards this goal.

A hearing was held on the budget. Ms. Hill presented a summary on AYP. Dr. Weninger and Cheryl Witham gave a TIF Update.
