Dr. Isoye reported the following: 1) English teacher Jessica Stovall won the Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching; 2) Japanese teacher Yoko Schmadeke, won the 2014 Cultural Achievement Award from the Japan America Society of Chicago for organizing OPRF's exchange program with Japanese students as well as creating the school's annual Japanese Festival; 3) School nurse Mary Ellen Sjostrom was honored with the Fitzsimmons Award for Excellence in Public Health, given by the Oak Park Board

of Health and the Oak Park Department of Public Health. 4) 112 students receiving the OPRF Outstanding Improvement Award for raising their GPA a full point during first semester; 5) 120 students won the Human Relations Award for having a positive impact on school culture; 6) Students of the Quarter and their families were honored by faculty, staff, and their families at a breakfast earlier in April; 6) Grace Niewijk won first place in the Midwest Research Competition: Positive Impact Investigatory Design for developing a novel antimicrobial bandage and gel based on slime of the Pacific hagfish. Eight other OPRF students were finalists in the competition; 7) Senior Jared Corbett won first place in the national P.L.A.T.O. contest for his essay "Probablistic Chains" which defended hard determinism against both compatibilist and libertarian arguments for free will; 8) The Varsity Huskie Scholastic Bowl team qualified to compete at the May 31-June 1 National Academic Quiz Tournaments (NAQT) National Championship meet; 9) OPRF senior and Olympic speed skater Emery Lehman visited the White House, met President Obama and the First Lady, and was part of the "Best of U.S. Awards Show"; 10) "U.S. News & World Report" ranked OPRF number 19 in in the state, out of 131 Illinois high schools that made its list.
